WELL, I THINK WE'LL CALL THIS MEETING TO ORDER,
THE CAMP CROFT RESTORATION ADVISORY BOARD. I

APPRECIATE ALL THE BOARD MEMBERS COMING. MR.

MULLINAX IS OUT OF TOWN, SO HE WON'T BE HERE TODAY.

HE'S GONE TO CHARLESTON. WE'VE GOT A NEW MAN FROM
THE CORPS. I THINK HIS NAME IS SPENCER. IF YOU

WANT TO INTRODUCE YOURSELF AND TELL PEOPLE A LITTLE

BIT ABOUT YOU.

BY SPENCER O'NEAL:

OKAY. MY NAME IS SPENCER O'NEAL FROM THE
HUNTSVILLE CORPS. I'VE BEEN WORKING ON SOME
PROJECTS IN THE SOUTH CAROLINA AREA. I'VE BEEN
WORKING ON UNEXPLODED ORDNANCE NOW FOR ABOUT FIVE
YEARS AND HAD TEN YEARS PRIOR TO THAT IN THE
MILITARY. I'M FAMILIAR WITH IT A LITTLE BIT, A
LITTLE BIT MORE THAN I WANT TO BE SOMETIMES, BUT I'M
FAMILIAR WITH IT A LITTLE BIT. AND I JUST CAME BACK
FROM IRAQ, WHICH WAS A PRETTY INTERESTING 15 MONTHS
OF MY LIFE. BUT NOW THAT'S OVER AND I'M BACK HERE
AND I'M AVAILABLE IF YOU HAVE ANYTHING, ANY NEEDS.

WELL, THANK YOU, SPENCER. I SEE

REPRESENTATIVES FROM THE FORESTRY COMMISSION AND THE

FIRE DEPARTMENT AT CROFT. I DON'T SEE ANYONE FROM

THE SHERIFF'S OFFICE, SO I GUESS WE'LL JUST GO AHEAD

AND START WITH THE NEW BUSINESS, IF YOU WANT TO,

SUZY.

BY SUZY CANTOR-McKINNEY:

OKAY. THANK YOU, JIMMY. I'D LIKE TO REMIND

EVERYONE TO STATE YOUR NAME WHEN YOU'RE SPEAKING AND

SPEAK CLEARLY FOR OUR TRANSCRIBER AND TO PLEASE SIGN

IN AFTER THE MEETING IF YOU HAVEN'T ALREADY. I'D

LIKE TO WISH EVERYONE A HAPPY NEW YEAR.

WHAT I WOULD LIKE TO DO NOW IS REVIEW OUR
PROCESS FOR THE SELECTION OF OUR CURRENT R.A.B. WE
RECEIVED 12 APPLICATIONS IN RESPONSE TO OUR REQUEST
FOR INTERESTED MEMBERS SERVING ON THE R.A.B. FOR
2009. WE HAD THE NINE OPENINGS PER THE BY-LAWS. AS
SUCH, WE THEN COMPRISED, PER THE BY-LAWS, A
SELECTION PANEL TO REVIEW THOSE 12 APPLICATIONS AND
THE SELECTION PANEL WAS COMPRISED OF THREE FORMER

R.A.B. MEMBERS AND AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS ROUTINELY AT OUR MEETINGS AND HAS DEMONSTRATED HIS INTEREST IN THE PROJECT BASED ON THE NUMBER OF YEARS THAT HE HAS BEEN IN ATTENDANCE. SO, A WELL-ROUNDED GROUP OF INDIVIDUALS ON OUR SELECTION PANEL. THEY REVIEWED ALL OF THE APPLICATIONS. THEY THEN MADE THEIR RECOMMENDATIONS THAT WENT ON TO THE CORPS OF ENGINEERS FOR THE CORPS' CONCURRENCE. THE CORPS HAS CONCURRED ON THE NINE INDIVIDUALS THAT ARE SEATED HERE, AND I WOULD LIKE TO GO AHEAD AND INTRODUCE EVERYONE. WE HAVE RONALD CRAWLEY, GARY HAYES, JOHN HOLCOMB, BUBBA LITTLEJOHN, FRED MARLER, GEORGE MULLINAX, BILL SHOOLBRED, EMILE SPIETH, AND JIMMY TOBIAS. AND I WANT TO THANK EVERYONE'S INTEREST IN PARTICIPATING IN OUR MEETINGS, WHETHER YOU'RE SERVING ON THE BOARD OR AN ATTENDEE AT OUR MEETING. AS YOU ALL ARE AWARE, WHETHER YOU'RE ON THE BOARD OR IN THE AUDIENCE, ALL OF OUR MEETINGS ARE DOCUMENTED VIA A FORMAL TRANSCRIPT, SO ANY COMMENTS, CONCERNS, RECOMMENDATIONS ON EITHER SIDE ARE DOCUMENTED FOR ACTION. SO, AGAIN, THANK YOU, EVERYONE, FOR YOUR

PARTICIPATION AND YOUR CONTINUED INTEREST IN THE PROJECT. FOR THE BOARD MEMBERS, JUST TO LET YOU KNOW A LITTLE BIT WHAT'S IN FRONT OF YOU, YOU DO HAVE NEW INSERTS FOR THE FRONT OF YOUR BINDERS FOR 2009 AND A LIST OF CONTACT INFORMATION FOR EACH OF THE MEMBERS. SO, PLEASE LOOK THROUGH THAT LIST, AND IF THERE ARE ANY CORRECTIONS THAT NEED TO BE MADE, JUST MARK THOSE UP FOR ME AND I'LL MAKE SURE TO CORRECT THAT ACCORDINGLY.

AND WITH THAT, WE CAN GO ON TO THE PROJECT UPDATE.

BY JIMMY TOBIAS:

OKAY.

BY SUZY CANTOR-MCKINNEY:

DO YOU WANT ME TO UPDATE?

BY JIMMY TOBIAS:

OKAY.

BY SUZY CANTOR-MCKINNEY:

OKAY. I AM ALSO THE TECHNICAL REPRESENTATIVE
TONIGHT FROM ZAPATA. OUR PROJECT MANAGER AND
PROGRAM MANAGER ARE ON OTHER TRAVEL THIS EVENING.

SO, I WANTED TO GIVE YOU AN UPDATE ON THE ACTUAL PROJECT STATUS.

IF YOU RECALL FROM OUR PREVIOUS MEETINGS, TWO AREAS WERE GEOPHYSICALLY MAPPED. THERE WAS A BUFFER AREA AROUND THE WEDGEWOOD NEIGHBORHOOD BETWEEN THE NEIGHBORHOOD AND THE GOLF COURSE. AND THEN, ALSO, OOU11C, WHICH IS APPROXIMATELY TEN ACRES THAT'S ADJACENT TO CEDAR SPRINGS DRIVE BETWEEN HUNTINGTON DRIVE AND MCKAY AVENUE. THE RESULTS OF THAT DIGITAL GEOPHYSICAL SURVEY RESULTED IN THOUSANDS OF SUBSURFACE METALLIC ANOMALIES. AND THROUGH PROCESSING PROCEDURES AND MATHEMATICAL ALGORITHMS, THOSE ANOMALIES WERE THEN REDUCED TO WHICH ONES WOULD BE MOST LIKELY TO REPRESENT AN ORDNANCE-LIKE ITEM. BASED UPON WHAT IS THE MOST PROBABLE MUNITION IN THOSE TWO RESPECTIVE AREAS, A MARK TWO GRENADE, BASED UPON THE USAGE AROUND THE WEDGEWOOD NEIGHBORHOOD; AND A RIFLE GRENADE OFF OF CEDAR SPRINGS DRIVE. THE SELECTION FOR THE NEXT PHASE OF WORK, WHAT WE WOULD ACTUALLY GO AND DIG AS PART OF THE REMOVAL PROCESS, WHICH ANOMALIES ARE TARGETED

FOR THAT CLEARANCE HAVE BEEN APPROVED BY THE CORPS
OF ENGINEERS. SO, THE NEXT PHASE IS ACTUALLY TO GO
OUT AND DIG THOSE, AND THAT IS ALL PENDING FUNDING.
SO WE HAVE A TASK ORDER THAT ALLOWS US TO GO OUT
THERE AND CONDUCT THAT REMOVAL PHASE, BUT IT IS NOT
FUNDED AT THIS POINT IN TIME. BASED UPON THE NUMBER
OF ANOMALIES WE ANTICIPATE AND THE TEAM SIZES THAT
WE CAN PUT OUT IN THE FIELD, WE ANTICIPATE ABOUT
THREE TO FOUR WEEKS IN EACH AREA.

NOW, BASED UPON SOME NEW FORMULAS THAT THE

CORPS OF ENGINEERS AND CALCULATIONS THAT THE CORPS

HAS DEVELOPED, THE EXCLUSION ZONE OR SAFETY ZONES

FOR THE AREA AROUND THE ANOMALY WHERE THERE CAN BE

NO OTHER INDIVIDUALS OR RESIDENTS, IS MUCH SMALLER

THAN IN YEARS PAST. THE GOOD PART OF THAT IS IT

WILL GREATLY MINIMIZE US HAVING TO DO ANY

EVACUATIONS, IF AT ALL. SO, THERE SHOULD BE MINIMAL

TO NO DISRUPTION TO ANY OF THE LOCAL RESIDENTS.

POSSIBLY A LITTLE BIT OF TRAFFIC CONTROL, BUT THAT'S

IT. SO, THE EFFORTS THAT WE USED TO HAVE IN YEARS

PAST WHERE WE'VE HAD TO EVACUATE SEVERAL HOMES AT A

GIVEN TIME WHILE WE ARE DIGGING, BASED UPON THE LOCATION OF THE ANOMALIES AND THAT NEW REDUCED SAFETY DISTANCE, WILL MINIMIZE THAT IMPACT.

SO, AGAIN, THE SCHEDULE NOW TO GET OUT THERE

AND ACTUALLY DO THAT REMOVAL IN THOSE TWO AREAS IS

TRULY DEPENDENT UPON THE FUNDING. SHAWN, I DON'T

KNOW OR SPENCER, IF YOU MIGHT HAVE AN UPDATE ON THE

STATUS.

BY SHAWN BOONE:

THERE'S NO FUNDING SCHEDULED FOR THIS FISCAL
YEAR, WHICH RUNS THROUGH THE END OF SEPTEMBER.
HOWEVER, THERE IS TALK OF THE STIMULUS PLAN I'M SURE
YOU'VE ALL HEARD ABOUT ON THE NEWS. AND WHEN ASKED
WHETHER WE WANTED FUNDING FOR NOT ONLY CAMP CROFT,
BUT THE PROGRAM WITH F.U.D.S. IN GENERAL, WE, OF
COURSE, SAID YES. AND SO, WE'RE WAITING TO HEAR THE
DETAILS ON WHAT COMES OUT IN THE BILL.

BY SUZY CANTOR-MCKINNEY:

SO, WITH THAT SAID, CORRECT ---

BY SHAWN BOONE:

WE HAVE A FIRM MAYBE.

BY SUZY CANTOR-MCKINNEY:

A FIRM MAYBE, AND RIGHT NOW, WE DO NOT HAVE

FIELD WORK SCHEDULED IN THE NEAR FUTURE. OBVIOUSLY,

WITH THE GOLF COURSE BEING ADJACENT TO THESE AREAS,

THERE WOULD BE A SIGNIFICANT AMOUNT OF COORDINATION

TO MINIMIZE THE IMPACT TO THAT OPERATION, AS WELL.

AS A REMINDER, THOUGH, ANYTHING THAT MIGHT BE FOUND

OR ANY SUSPECT ITEMS, OUR PROCEDURE IS STILL, AS

ALWAYS, TO CALL 911 FOR IMMEDIATE RESPONSE TO ANY

SUSPECT ITEMS.

BY GARY HAYES:

SO, THESE ARE TWO DIFFERENT CONTRACTS?

BY SUZY CANTOR-MCKINNEY:

ONE TASK ORDER UNDER AN EXISTING TASK ORDER UNDER A CONTRACT.

BY GARY HAYES:

AND EACH ONE WILL TAKE TWO OR THREE -- THREE TO FOUR WEEKS?

BY SUZY CANTOR-McKINNEY:

EACH AREA WITHIN THAT ONE TASK ORDER WOULD TAKE THREE TO FOUR WEEKS, DEPENDING UPON OUR TEAM SIZE

AND HOW QUICKLY WE CAN GO THROUGH.

BY GARY HAYES:

OKAY. IS THERE A FIRM PRICE ON THESE?

BY SUZY CANTOR-McKINNEY:

NO. WE HAVE PROPOSED TO THE CORPS, BASED UPON THE ANOMALIES THAT WERE SELECTED FOR EXCAVATION, A COST THAT IT WOULD TAKE, AND UNTIL THE FUNDING IS AVAILABLE, THEN THAT FIXED AMOUNT WOULD BE NEGOTIATED. SO, WE'RE STILL IN THAT PROCESS.

BY GARY HAYES:

THAT'S FOR EACH ONE, OR IS THAT FOR THE ---

BY SUZY CANTOR-McKINNEY:

IT'S FOR EACH AREA. IT'S FOR THE REMAINDER OF OOU3 AND OOU11 ---

BY GARY HAYES:

SO, IF YOU CAN GET MONEY FOR ONE AREA, YOU CAN GO AHEAD AND DO THAT AREA ---

BY SHAWN BOONE:

THAT'S CORRECT.

BY SPENCER O'NEAL:

CORRECT.

BY GARY HAYES:

AND THEN, IF MONEY -- IN OTHER WORDS, IF MONEY COMES IN FOR BOTH, YOU CAN DO BOTH?

BY SUZY CANTOR-McKINNEY:

RIGHT.

BY SPENCER O'NEAL:

CORRECT.

BY SUZY CANTOR-McKINNEY:

RIGHT.

BY GARY HAYES:

BUT THERE'S NOT A SET AMOUNT OF MONEY. IS

THERE -- WHAT'S THE PEAK TO DO ONE?

BY SHAWN BOONE:

WHAT HAS BEEN NEGOTIATED IS THE NUMBER OF

ANOMALIES THAT THEY WILL EXCAVATE. THEY'VE ALREADY

LOOKED AT THE GEOPHYSICAL DATA THAT THEY'VE

COLLECTED. AND SO, WHAT WE'RE WAITING ON IS -- WHEN

WE GET FUNDING, THEN WE'LL NEGOTIATE THE PRICE FOR

EXCAVATING THAT NUMBER OF ANOMALIES. IT'S DIFFICULT

TO NEGOTIATE A CONTRACT, BEING THAT YOU DON'T KNOW

WHEN THE WORK WILL ACTUALLY BE DONE, AND WE ALL KNOW

PRICES CHANGE FOR ALL KINDS OF THINGS. SO, IT'S
HARD TO HOLD A CONTRACTOR OR THE GOVERNMENT
RESPONSIBLE FOR SOMETHING THAT'S BEEN NEGOTIATED
YEARS IN THE PAST OR THAT MIGHT TAKE PLACE YEARS IN
THE FUTURE.

BY GARY HAYES:

DO YOU HAVE A NUMBER OF ANOMALIES FOR EACH AREA?

BY SUZY CANTOR-McKINNEY:

YES.

BY SPENCER O'NEAL:

YES, WE DO.

BY SUZY CANTOR-McKINNEY:

BASED UPON THE NUMBERS THAT JEFF SCHWAM, OUR PROJECT MANAGER, HAD PROVIDED ME THIS EVENING, IT'S ESTIMATED AT 4,865 ANOMALIES IN OOU3, WHICH IS THE BUFFER AREA BETWEEN THE RESIDENTS AND THE GOLF COURSE AND INTO A LITTLE BIT OF THE GOLF COURSE PROPERTY. AND APPROXIMATELY 2,000 ANOMALIES IN 11C, WHICH IS THE AREA OFF OF CEDAR SPRINGS DRIVE. AND OUR PRODUCTION RATE RIGHT NOW, AND IT, AGAIN,

DEPENDS ON THE WEATHER EXTREMES AND THE AMOUNT OF
VEGETATION THAT HAS SINCE GROWN BACK FROM THE
INVESTIGATION, OUR PRODUCTION RATE IS APPROXIMATELY
75 DIGS PER TEAM PER DAY. SO, IF YOU HAVE MULTIPLE
TEAMS OUT THERE, YOU CAN DIG A COUPLE HUNDRED
ANOMALIES A DAY AND EVALUATE THEM AS FAR AS WHETHER
THEY'RE HAZARDOUS OR NOT, TRANSPORT THEM OFF AS
SCRAP OR DO THE DEMOLITION IF THEY'RE LIVE.

BY BILL SHOOLBRED:

BUT YOU SAID YOU WOULDN'T HAVE TO EXCAVATE ALL OF THOSE ANOMALIES. YOU WERE ---

BY SUZY CANTOR-McKINNEY:

THOSE ARE THE ONES THAT HAVE BEEN TARGETED FOR EXCAVATION.

BY BILL SHOOLBRED:

OKAY.

BY SUZY CANTOR-McKINNEY:

THAT'S KIND OF THE DOWN SELECTED LIST. ANY OTHER QUESTIONS?

BY JIMMY TOBIAS:

OKAY. I BELIEVE WE'LL MOVE ON. I DON'T THINK

WE HAVE A REPRESENTATIVE OF THE SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT HERE, DO WE?

BY GARY HAYES:

I TALKED TO DAYS LAST WEEK AND HE SAID HE WAS GOING TO BE HERE. SOMETHING MUST HAVE CAME UP.

BY JIMMY TOBIAS:

OKAY. WELL, IF HE SHOWS UP, WE'LL BRING HIM

IN. SO, WE'LL JUST MOVE RIGHT ON ALONG NOW TO THE

CERTIFICATES OF APPRECIATION.

BY SHAWN BOONE:

WE MARKED A MILESTONE TONIGHT. WE HAVE A NEW R.A.B. IN PLACE. AND WE'RE ALSO MARKING THE END OF THE OLD R.A.B. YOU KNOW, WHEN PEOPLE ASK ME WHAT I DO WITH THE CORPS OF ENGINEERS, I, OF COURSE, HAVE TO EXPLAIN WHAT A F.U.D.S. IS AND THEN I HAVE TO EXPLAIN ALL THE RELEVANT ENVIRONMENTAL LAWS, WHICH TAKES ME HOURS AND HOURS. BUT YOU KNOW, ONE POINT I ALWAYS LIKE TO BRING PEOPLE BACK TO IS THAT ALL THE WORK WE DO AND ALL THE MONEY WE SPEND AND ALL THE LAWS THAT PERTAIN TO IT ARE ALL ABOUT THE PEOPLE WHO LIVE AND WORK IN THE AREA OF THE PROJECT. AND THIS

BOARD IS WHERE THE RUBBER HITS THE ROAD. YOU KNOW, I'M IN MY OFFICE IN CHARLESTON DOING ACCOUNTING OR CONTRACT STUFF. YOU KNOW, I'M VERY INSULATED. AND THE BOARD HERE, THE ADVISORY BOARD IS THE WHEELS ON THE GROUND. SO, I'D LIKE TO THANK THE OLD BOARD, AND WE HAVE A CERTIFICATE FOR EACH ONE OF THE MEMBERS THAT SERVED AND WE ALSO HAVE A CERTIFICATE FOR THE ONES WHO HELPED US PICK THIS NEW, SHINY NEW BOARD. SO, I'M JUST GOING TO READ THE NAMES OUT. I WON'T EMBARRASS ANYBODY BY MAKING THEM PARADE PAST OR ANYTHING. SO, OF COURSE, THERE'S OUR CHAIRMAN, JIMMY TOBIAS. LET ME SEE. THERE'S BILL SHOOLBRED, FRED MARLER, NICK LANE, JOHN HOLCOMB, GARY HAYES, CRIS CRISSINGER, DICKIE CORBIN, LARRY COOPER, EMIL SPIETH, GEORGE MULLINAX, WILLIAM LITTLEJOHN (ALSO KNOWN AS BUBBA LITTLEJOHN), CURTIS SMITH, GLENN BOUGHMAN, DONALD GIBSON, AND ROBIN ZIMMERMAN. THANK YOU ALL VERY MUCH. IF YOU'RE HERE, THANK YOU.

BY JIMMY TOBIAS:

ALL RIGHT. I GUESS WE'LL TAKE UP OLD BUSINESS NOW.

BY SUZY CANTOR-McKINNEY:

AND UPON MY REVIEW OF THE TRANSCRIPTS FROM OUR
LAST MEETING, I DID NOT NOTE ANY OPEN OR OLD
BUSINESS THAT NEEDED TO BE ADDRESSED. DOES THE
BOARD HAVE ANY BUSINESS FOR THIS EVENING?

BY JIMMY TOBIAS:

I DON'T BELIEVE SO.

BY GARY HAYES:

WELL, LET'S SAY WHO WAS ON THE SELECTION COMMITTEE.

BY SUZY CANTOR-McKINNEY:

YES. THE SELECTION COMMITTEE WAS -- AGAIN, IT
WAS THREE FORMER R.A.B. MEMBERS, CURTIS SMITH, DON
GIBSON, AND GLENN BOUGHMAN, AND ROBIN ZIMMERMAN.

BY GARY HAYES:

WELL, GIBSON WAS ON THE BOARD.

BY SUZY CANTOR-McKINNEY:

BUT HE DID NOT APPLY FOR THIS BOARD. THE THREE FORMER BOARD MEMBERS DID NOT APPLY FOR -- TO SIT ON THIS TERM.

BY GARY HAYES:

SO, A MEMBER OF THE BOARD IS SELECTING THE NEW BOARD.

BY SUZY CANTOR-McKINNEY:

AND AN ATTENDEE, A REGULAR MEETING ATTENDEE.

BY JIMMY TOBIAS:

ALL RIGHT. DO WE HAVE ANY NEW BUSINESS TOPICS?

OKAY. AND THEN, I'M GOING TO LET THE PUBLIC ASK A

FEW QUESTIONS, IF ANYONE CARES TO. EDWIN, YOU GOT

ANY QUESTIONS?

BY EDWIN HOLT:

CONSIDERING THE GOLF COURSE RUNS INTO MY BACK
YARD ---

BY SUZY CANTOR-McKINNEY:

WELL ---

BY EDWIN HOLT:

WHERE DOES THE BUFFER START?

BY SUZY CANTOR-McKINNEY:

AND THAT'S A GOOD QUESTION, AND I USE THAT TERM

ACTUALLY LOOSELY. IT'S PART -- SOME OF THEM ARE

RESIDENTIAL PROPERTIES AND SOME OF IT IS THE GOLF

COURSE PROPERTY. IT'S THAT AREA WHERE ACTUALLY A

LOT OF THOSE PROPERTIES MEET.

BY EDWIN HOLT:

JUST MEET, YES.

BY SUZY CANTOR-McKINNEY:

SO, IT'S EITHER OWNED BY THE GOLF COURSE OR A PRIVATE RESIDENT.

BY EDWIN HOLT:

WELL, ARE WE TALKING FOOTAGE, DEPTH OR WHAT IS
THE DIMENSION, I GUESS, OR IS THERE A BUFFER?

BY SUZY CANTOR-McKINNEY:
